Brain Drain - Adolescents and Addiction: Why the Teen Brain is Vulnerable

Brain Drain is an engaging and highly interactive presentation that provides current, research-based information on various aspects of drug abuse and addiction. Participants will become familiar with specific parts of the brain and how they function, identify drugs of abuse and their specific impact on a developing brain, explain the concept of addiction and a young person's heightened vulnerability, dispel myths surrounding certain drugs, highlight the importance of remaining substance free, and provide examples of potential adolescent dialogue on where and who to reach out to for support.



The 40 Developmental Assets and Developmental Relationship Framework developed by The Search Institute, as well as Nan Henderson's Model of Resilience will be explored. Participants will engage in activities appropriate to implement with youth, parents, and families. Additionally, resources will be shared to actively support resiliency building in various community settings.



In addition to Ursula's 3 years with Caron's Student Assistance Program as the Regional Coordinator, she spent nearly 20 years as a well-regarded educator and instructional leader.
